Wheelchair basketball is one of the most popular sports in the Paralympic Games and as the London 2012 Paralympics approaches, more clubs are offering the opportunity to get involved in the sport.

Noadswood School near Hythe, for example, has recently started a club. The wheelchair basketball sessions are held at the school every Thursday from 4pm to 5pm and are open to boys and girls aged seven to 19, whether you are a wheelchair user or not. The school provides the adapted sports wheelchairs for both wheelchair users and non-wheelchair users.
